Dear Parents/Carers,

Thank you very much for responding to our questionnaire. We had a very high return rate, the best yet and this has given us a very positive picture of your views. The reception class undertook a separate survey and taking this into account, 85% of our families responded to this survey.

We are really pleased with the wonderfully positive response to key questions about your children's education. Crucially, we are thrilled that 100% of you agree and 86% of you strongly agree that the school keeps their child/ren safe. Safeguarding and children's welfare is top of our agenda, which was recognised last academic year in external audits by the Local Authority, centred on safeguarding procedures and Child Protection. These both celebrated the school's rigorous and thorough approaches, which we will continue to develop and implement.

We are also delighted with the positive responses regarding children's enjoyment of school and the high expectations of the staff. As you know, we have been developing our Learning Zone approach from Foundation Stage and Key Stage One into Key Stage Two over the last three years, and this has undoubtedly had a positive impact on children's attitudes towards school and learning. Children often comment on how much they enjoy the responsibility of their independent learning challenges, while benefiting from the small group focus learning with the teachers in the Basic Skills. Children often talk about how the environment for learning feels less 'cramped' as a result of the development of the Zones and the many visitors we have around school comment on the focused 'buzz' for learning and children's engagement in their independent tasks.

Children's behaviour in and around school is excellent, and we are pleased that you agree with this. As well as their embodiment of the Golden Rules in the way that they interact with each other, children's learning behaviour – their focus, resilience and productivity in both focused and independent learning – is of a high standard. The children have high expectations of their own behaviour and last year the House Leaders developed the behaviour system even further to make it more stringent. The introduction of class behaviour books, which keep an ongoing record of rewards and sanctions, alongside the development of the behaviour tree which can be seen in the entrance hall, are all as a result of the ideas and hard work of the children.

We continue to try and provide as many opportunities as possible for you to come into school. Coffee Mornings, Come to Lunch and informal drop ins have all been held so far this year, as well as workshops in maths, spelling and grammar, mindset behaviour and art. These workshops have been incredibly highly evaluated and the feedback has been much appreciated by staff. We recognise that it can be difficult for working parents to attend these events, and thus we have provided all workshop dates for the rest of the academic year to give you as much notice to plan attendance if you are able.

We are proud of our ever-expanding outdoor learning environment, and the children's role in planting and harvesting the vegetables that are used in our kitchen. This, alongside collecting the



eggs from the chickens, is something we believe is really important to enable them to understand where food comes from and make discerning choices about healthy lifestyles. We go as far as we can to support children in maintaining these, and the positive feedback from the recent school meals survey supports this. We have a wonderful staff team throughout the school, led by teachers who work incredibly hard and care deeply for the welfare and progress of the children. The school is an exciting place to walk into: creative, focused and dedicated. Thank you for the part you play in this and for all your support of the school.
